The Canberra Deep Space Communication Complex (CDSCC) has four large communication antennas.

These antennas, sometimes called "dishes", make it possible for us to communicate with spacecraft that can be millions or even billion of kilometres away from the Earth.

Nearly everything we discover about space comes through antennas like these. What can you discover? Try answering these questions...
